Upcoming XSEDE Research Allocation Deadlines

The XSEDE Research Allocations Committee (XRAC) reviews and makes resource allocation awards on a quarterly basis. As a rule of thumb, research allocation proposals are due by the 15th day of each calendar quarter for allocations that would, if awarded, start at the beginning of the next calendar quarter. Research allocations are one year in duration. The proposal deadlines for the next five review and award cycles are as follows:

Proposal Deadline	For Allocations to Start	For Allocations to End
October 15, 2012	January 1, 2013	December 31, 2013
January 15, 2013	April 1, 2013	March 31, 2014
April 15, 2013	July 1, 2013	June 30, 2014

Note: Startup, Education and Campus Champion allocation requests are accepted, reviewed and approved on a continuing basis (no deadlines). However, please allow at least two weeks for such requests to be reviewed and allocated.

Campus Champion Monthly Conference Calls
